

## Fra Angelico

- ➤ Born in Tuscany, 1387; died in Rome, 1455
- Wanted to be Dominican Monk; joined the Order of Preachers
- > Art: an extension of his devotion to God
- > Painted frescoes: Convent of San Marco
- Declined office of Archbishop of Florence

### Vasari, 16th Century Art Historian


"Fra Angelico lead a simple and devout life... He lived in purity and holiness and befriended the poor...He worked continuously at his paintings and would chose only holy subjects. He would often comment that anyone practicing the art of painting needed a quiet and untroubled life..."



### Vasari on Fra Angelico

"He said: 'The man who occupies himself with the things of Christ should live with Christ and would never take up his brush without a prayer.' Whenever he painted a crucifixion, tears would stream down his face; and it is no wonder that the faces and attitudes of his figures express the depth and sincerity of his Christian piety."







### Isaiah's Prophecies

#### The Messiah will be...

- 1. Called God's Servant (49.2)
- 2. Descended from Jesse/ line of David (11.1, 10)
- 3. Empowered by the Holy Spirit (11.2; 42.1)
- 4. Gentle to the weak (42.3)
- 5. Obedient to God in His mission (50.4-9)
- 6. Voluntarily submit to suffering (50.6; 53.7-8)

## Isaiah's Prophecies


The Messiah will...

- 7. Be rejected by Israel (49.7; 53.3)
- 8. Bear the sins of the world (53.4-6)
- 9. Triumph over death (53.10)
- 10. Be exalted (52.13)
- 11. Manifest God's glory (49.3)
- 12. Restore Israel spiritually to God and physically to the land (49.5, 8)

## Isaiah's Prophecies


The Messiah will...

- 13. Reign on David's throne (9.7)
- 14. Make a New Covenant with Israel (42.6; 49.8-9)
- 15. Be a light to the Gentiles (42.6; 49.6)
- 16. Be worshipped by Gentiles (49.7; 52.15)
- 17. Govern the world (9.6)
- 18. Judge in righteousness and justice (11.3-5)






"Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and shall call his name Immanuel."

Gabriel: "The Holy Spirit shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee." (Luke 1.35)


Mary: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to Thy word." (Luke 1.38)





### Malcolm Muggeridge

As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy.


Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished."

"But... the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said,


'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is

conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.' "






"She will give birth to a Son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." –Matthew 1.18-21
